JLARC workplan for 2020

Four primary goals

- Inform legislative policy making
- Ensure agency compliance with legislative intent
- Identify ways to improve government efficiency and effectiveness
- Identify ways to achieve cost savings

Key functions

- In-depth program and agency evaluations
- Policy studies
- Ongoing oversight
- Fiscal analysis

JLARC conducts 5 or 6 major studies each year

- Studies review policy areas, or specific state programs or agencies
 - Workers' Compensation, Gaming
 - Foster Care, Inmate Health Care
 - Virginia Economic Development Partnership,
 Department of Game and Inland Fisheries
- Study duration typically 9 to 12 months

Ongoing oversight and fiscal analysis

- Perform ongoing oversight and fiscal analysis
 - VITA, VRS, Virginia529, and Cardinal
 - Economic development incentives
 - Health and Human Resources
 - State spending
- Conduct fiscal impact reviews during session

JLARC's value

- JLARC uniquely positioned to conduct in-depth, original research
 - Policy analysts with extensive training and experience
 - Rigorous research process
 - Objective, non-partisan
- Helps legislators identify and address any problems in complex state programs and agencies
- Provides legislators with considerations, implications, and options needed to address major policy issues

JLARC process

- 1) JLARC *members* select study topics but may ask for staff assistance
- 2) JLARC staff conduct research independently and present findings and recommendations
- 3) JLARC *members* draft and enact legislation based on staff recommendations

Commission typically meets monthly from May through December*

- Staff present summary findings and recommendations to Commission
- Members ask questions about study findings and recommendations
- Members "receive" rather than approve reports
- Subject agency typically provides a short response after staff presentation

Report findings provided at differing levels of detail and in several formats

- Summaries, staff presentations, and written reports provide different levels of detail
- Members will receive reports in hardcopy and electronically
- All reports are available online

Auditor of Public Accounts and JLARC

- Auditor is ex-officio member of JLARC
- Presents workplan annually
- Requests JLARC approval for special projects
- Ongoing collaboration and coordination between staffs

New JLARC membership offers opportunity to continue raising standard of excellence

Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity (September)

- Study areas
 - Overall agency management
 - SWaM and other certification programs
 - Technical assistance programs
 - Business financing
 - SWaM policy goals and small business definition

Virginia Department of Education (October)

- Study areas
 - Overall agency management
 - Ensuring local school division compliance with laws, regulations, and policy
 - Support and technical assistance to school divisions
 - Coordination with other state agencies
 - Role and relationship with Board of Education

Legalizing Marijuana in Virginia (November)

- Study areas
 - Legal, criminal justice, and public health considerations
 - Commercial licensing
 - State regulatory and administrative structure
 - Taxation and revenue
 - Opportunities to benefit minority populations disproportionately affected by prohibition

Children's Services Act (November)

- Study areas
 - Spending growth
 - Private day school placements
 - Local services planning and case management
 - Child outcomes
 - State oversight and support

K-12 Special Education (December)

- Study areas
 - Identification of students
 - IEP design and implementation
 - Staffing levels of teachers and support professionals
 - Inclusion
 - Student outcomes
 - VDOE monitoring and oversight

- VRS (July and December) and VA529 oversight (every other July)
- Regional and infrastructure economic development incentives (September)
- Virginia Information Technologies Agency (October)

Regional and Infrastructure Economic Development Incentives (September)

- Study areas
 - 4 regional/distressed region grants
 - 4 infrastructure development grants
 - 2 tax credits
 - Reviewed for effectiveness and economic impact

Virginia Information Technologies Agency (October)

- Study areas
 - Implementation of new multi-supplier service model
 - Management of multi-supplier model and contracts
 - Quality of IT infrastructure services
 - VITA's organizational management to operate model
