





State Spending on the K–12 Standards of Quality: 2019 Update

Study mandate

- Standards of Quality (SOQ) annual spending reports
- Virginia Department of Education reports local spending
- JLARC reports state spending


State and localities share cost of meeting the K-12 SOQ

- Virginia's Standards of Quality
 - Prescribed by State Board of Education; subject to General Assembly revision
 - Specify type and minimum number of staff
- General Assembly estimates cost to meet K-12
 SOQ; apportions between state and localities

Several major factors drive K-12 SOQ spending

- Number of funded instructional and support positions
- Salaries and benefits
- Number of students
- Policy decisions


School divisions spent \$6.2B in state K-12 SOQ funds (FY19)



School divisions spent \$4,974 per student in K-12 SOQ funds (FY19)

- For first time in many years, the number of K-12 students declined statewide
- Decline in number of students was marginal: 0.2% ($\approx 2,000$ students)

Total spending and spending per student have steadily increased over time



Top 10 divisions by spending received 49% of total state SOQ funding

SOQ spending per student ranged from \$7,813 to \$2,488, primarily due to ability to pay
