





Potential JLARC study topics

Meeting objectives

- Discuss potential study topics for 2025
- Develop list of study topics for consideration at next study subcommittee meeting

JLARC typically can complete at least 5 studies annually

- Staff has capacity to complete 5 substantial studies
 - Can do more if some studies have narrower scope
 - Can have a "pipeline" of future studies with later deadlines
- Studies would be initiated this fall, and most or all would be completed in 2025
- General Assembly could still direct more pressing studies through joint resolutions passed during 2025 session

JLARC can conduct several different types of reviews

- Policy reviews (prospective or current)
- Program evaluations
- Agency operations & management reviews

Historically, JLARC study topics have certain characteristics

- Topics of legislative interest or importance
- Researchable questions that can be answered with objective analysis
- Potential to improve programs or agency operations, reduce costs, or inform policy consideration

Several sources for this year's topic selection

- Joint resolution already approved
- Study resolutions referred from House Rules
- JLARC membership topics of interest
- JLARC study resolution previously approved
- Staff suggestions

Study resolution passed by House & Senate during 2024 legislative session

 Social, physical, emotional, and economic effects of gun violence on communities (HJ 76, Anthony + 7 co-patrons)

Study resolutions referred to JLARC from House Rules

- Impact of utility-scale solar development on agriculture, forestry, and the environment (HJ 12, Orrock)
- Scope and cost of the current laws penalizing drug possession as a felony (HJ 38, Cousins + 3 co-patrons)

Study resolution approved by JLARC in fall 2023

- State government modernization (Commission resolution, Nov 13, 2023)
- Process improvement & IT modernization
- Facilities in context of modern work patterns and telecommuting
- Personnel or procurement flexibilities
- Private sector and other government lessons learned

JLARC membership topics of interest

 Correctional programs (educational, vocational, other) to better prepare and assist inmates for reentry (Carr)

Other JLARC member study topic ideas for discussion

- Agencies?
- Programs?
- Policy topics?
- Other?

Other potential study topics (staff ideas)

- Health inspection & regulation
- Two-year institutions amid changing higher education and economic landscape

Actions and next steps

- Staff research topics as needed
- Study subcommittee convene again to prioritize topics to recommend to full Commission
- Full Commission consideration and approval of resolutions
